I volunteered in my teens and later served as board chair of the Associate Board, helping launch the May Day Run, now the annual Father's Day Run.



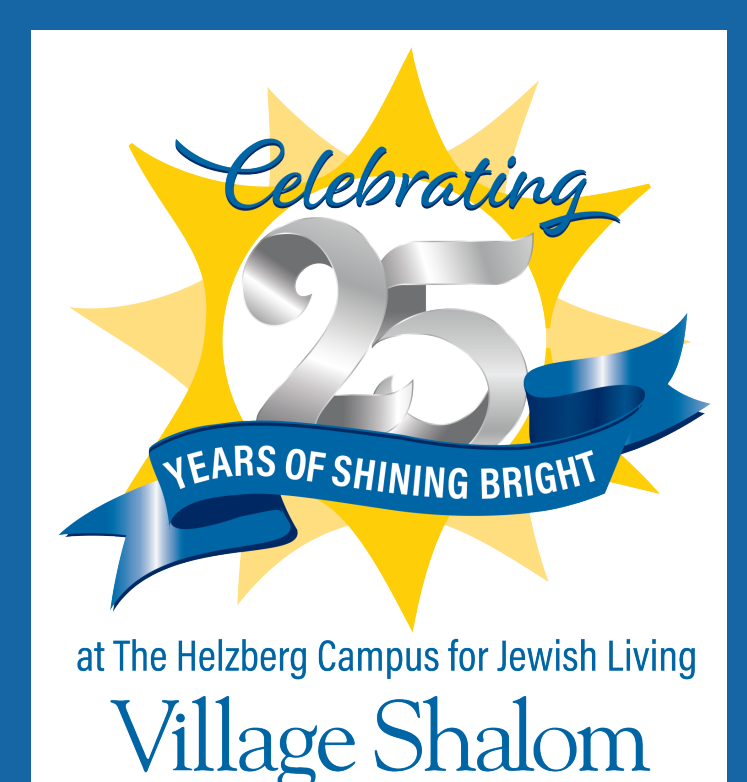
Celebrating 25 Years
